Attendance Matters

Today you should have all received our first Attendance Newsletter. This is designed to help us work together to ensure the best attendance possible for each child. We are also writing to some parents, where attendance is becoming or is already a cause for concern to look at ways in which we can work together to improve it.

Excellent Attendance! Pupils with this attendance should achieve the best they can.

Pupils with this attendance are more likely to achieve their targets at the end of the year.

Pupils with this attendance are missing approximately a month (20 days) of school per year and may fall behind in Maths, English and other subjects; it will be difficult for them to achieve their best.

These pupils are missing approximately 6 weeks of school a year. It will be very difficult for them to keep up and achieve their best.

Pupils are missing a day for every week of school. It will be almost impossible to keep up with their work and achieve their best.

The Year of Jubilee 2025

The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years.

The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope", and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis. In preparation for the 2025 Jubilee Year 'Pilgrims of Hope', 2024 has been designated a Year of Prayer by Pope Francis. It started during Advent. It is to be a year for prayer, rather than about prayer, during which we will be encouraged to deepen our own prayer life and love of God and to accompany others in theirs.

There is a particular focus on the *Our Father,* and this presents us with a great opportunity to go back to the basics of prayer.
